This may be a parent, family member, befriender, or a professional care giver arranged by the individual or their guardian, as appropriate.

Local Support opportunities to attend LiveArgyll Activities or Events:

To assist the individual in finding the right support in order to take part in liveArgyll activities, liveArgyll has a small number of volunteers who can be approached if requested, to give low level support to individuals. These volunteers, however, are not care professionals and are trained only as assistant sports volunteers.

Befriending is a positive way for volunteers to support people in their own communities and an opportunity to spend quality time with an individual on a regular basis.
